5. Highlights from the Elk Island Catholic Schools Board of Trustees, Ted Paszek

• At the May 26th, 2021 public meeting, the Board of Trustees approved the Division operating budget and school fees for the 2021-2022 school year.

Elk Island Catholic Schools' operating budget for 2021-2022 is \$82.6 million. With revenues projected at \$81.0 million, the Division plans to have an operating deficit of \$1.5 million for the 2021-2022 school year. The planned operating deficit will be supported by using the accumulated operating revenues from previous years.

• EICS serves over 7,800 students from pre-kindergarten to Grade 12 within 18 schools.

The projected class size averages for 2021-2022 are anticipated to remain stable in kindergarten to grade 9, with a slight increase anticipated in grade 10-12.

• At the May 26th, 2021 EICS Board of Trustees Public Board Meeting, the nominees and winners of 3 awards were announced.
