On September 20th, 2018 at the Emerald Hills Arena, the Scots Football Team took home the victory by crushing St. Francis Xavier 21-0. This was the Scots second win of the season, currently placing them third in the Miles Conference. This is already a substantial improvement over their past season, in which they finished without a single win. However, they've turned things around, excelling forward with both tenacity and determination.

"After last season, I feel like the league underestimates us. That could give us an advantage," states Loclen Cerra, a Wide Receiver/Slotback in his rookie year. "Our team has a lot of talent, I think this could really be our season."

All three touchdowns were scored by the player of the game, Sean Bleiken, a ruthless Running Back who always keeps his eye on the prize. Bleiken finished the game with the astonishing total of 311 rushing yards, granting him the spot of top offensive player. However, he wasn't the only beast on the field. Sean Ogundiya also found a spot within the top 3 offensive players with 27 rushing yards, trailing just behind Loclen Cerra, of whom succeeded in achieving 50 receiving yards.

Even so, the victory wouldn't have been possible without the Scots flawless defense, which didn't allow St. Francis to score a single point, as well as limiting them to a total of only 44 yards. Aidan Harrison, a captain in his senior year, was announced the top defensive player of the game with a triumphant total of 5.5 tackles. Trey Saretsky followed him with 2.0 tackles, Tyler Schwartz just behind with 1.5. This display of Lockdown defense was pure evidence of the phrase "Defense Wins Games."
