

We are blessed to have beautiful liturgies but we can always *do* better. Wednesday, September 25

Baptism, the Basis for All Ministry 7:00 – 9:00 pm

"Mother Church earnestly desires that all the faithful should be led to that fully conscious and active participation in liturgical celebrations, which is demanded by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation by the Christian people as "a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a redeemed people (1 Pet. 2:9; cf. 2:4-5), is their right and duty by reason of their baptism" (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 14). We will use the lens of what happens to us at baptism to explore the meaning of liturgical participation.



Bernadette Gasslein is a veteran of church and life. She's travelled from sea to sea in Canada, giving

workshops and training in her two loves: liturgy (and liturgical music) and catechesis. Bernadette holds a license in sacred theology with a specialization in pastoral catechetics from the Institut Catholique de Paris. She is editor of the prestigious journal Worship and author of several popular small books on the liturgy. In 2014, she was named Catholic Communicator of the Year by the Association of Roman Catholic Communicators of Canada, Since 1998 Bernadette has made her home in Edmonton, where she is a member of Resurrection Parish and a member of its music ministry.
