TIME ALLOCATIONS FOR IN-CLASS WRITTEN EXAMS

BLOCK 1	8:00am to end of block 1 Students may arrive early to class Transportation arrangements are the student's responsibility.

BLOCK 3	Start over lunch hour to end of block 3 Students may arrive early to class Suggestion: bring a small, quiet snack.
