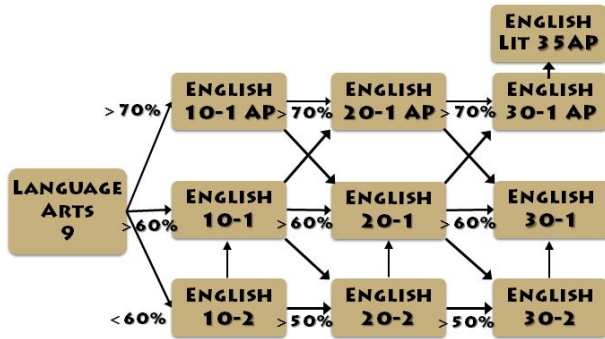

High School Program Sequences

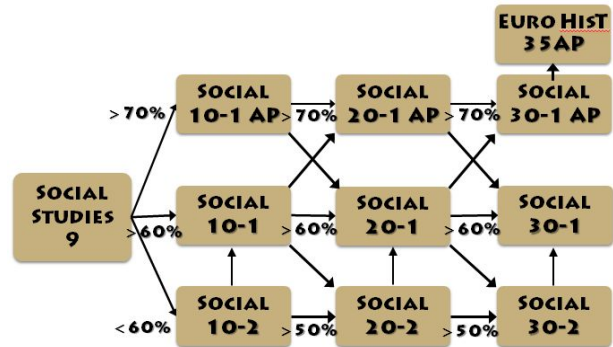
English Language Arts

- Minimum requirement for High School Diploma is English 30-1 or English 30-2.
- Students require English 30-1 for most post-secondary studies.



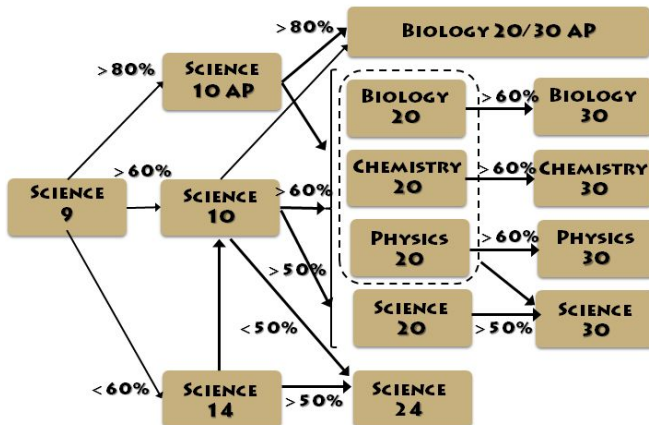
Social Studies

- Minimum requirement for High School Diploma is Social 30-1 or Social 30-2.



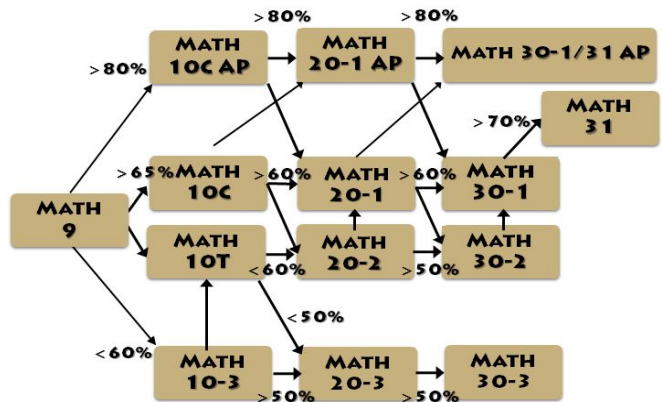
Sciences

- Minimum requirement for high school diploma is 20-level Science.
- Science 30 is accepted by many post-secondary faculties.



Mathematics

- Minimum requirement for high school diploma is a 20-level Math.
- Many post-secondary faculties accept both Math 30-1 and 30-2. Check with your post-secondary faculty of choice to see which course is relevant.
- Math 10T allows students who find Math more difficult time to develop competencies and to be successful.



Alberta High School Diploma Requirements Checklist

- 100 credits minimum
- English 30-1 or 30-2
- Social Studies 30-1 or 30-2
- 20-level Mathematics (Math 20-1, Math 20-2, or Math 20-3)
- 20-level Science (Science 20, Biology 20, Chemistry 20, Physics 20, or Science 24)
- Physical Education 10
- CALM 20 (Career and Life Management)
- 10 credits in CTS, Fine Arts, Languages, Physical Education 20/30, RAP
- 10 credits in 30-level courses other than English and Social

An additional requirement of being in a Catholic School and taking part in ABJ Grad Activities is the successful completion of 9 credits (three courses) of Religious Education through your three years of high school.

*Earn a Certificate of High School Achievement when you complete 80 credits in a combination of K&E and other courses.



Career and Education Information Sources

The following programs are available to help assist you in furthering your career and post-secondary planning, ensuring that you can plan your courses accordingly in high school:

1. myBlueprint

- This is a computerized program available to Archbishop Jordan High School students that follows a comprehensive education and career planning process to meet the learning needs, interests, and aspirations of all students. To access the program, your username and password will be the same as it is for you to log in to the ABJ Network. Go to www.myblueprint.ca. You will be prompted to log in. Your username is your ABJ ID number (6-digit number on your ABJ ID Card) and the password is the same as what is used for your school account.

2. ALIS

- ALIS (The Alberta Learning Information System) is a provincial online source for career, learning, and employment information at www.alis.alberta.ca
- Students can click on "I am still in High School" where students can then explore content on "Plan Your Career", "Explore Education and Training", "CAREERinsite", or "OCInfo", all of which are incredible resources that holistically support students as devise their plan for after high school.

3. myPass

It is expected that all students at Archbishop Jordan be responsible for creating and assessing their individual myPass accounts. myPass is an Alberta Education self-service website set up for Alberta students to: view diploma exam results, register to write a diploma exam, order High School transcripts, View progress towards a credential (diploma or certificate), and view a Detailed Academic Report (DAR) of all of your completed courses/credits.

To register for an account, you will need

- your Alberta Student Number (ASN) this is the longer 9-digit number on your ABJ student ID card
- a personal email address (do not use your school email)
- your date of birth

Timetable Expectations:

GRADE 10 students: must have a full timetable with no spares, 8 full blocks of time must be scheduled.

GRADE 11 students:

- if you have completed 40 or more credits from grade 10, you can register in the courses that you require for graduation and that meet your individual post-secondary plans (no minimum requirement)
- if you earned less than 40 credits, you need to register for a minimum of 35 credits

GRADE 12 students:

- if you have completed 70 or more credits from grades 10 and 11, you can register in the courses that you require for graduation and your individual post-secondary plans (no minimum requirement)
- if you have less than 70 credits, you need to register for a minimum of 35 credits

Your Schedule

Our schedule is made up of **8 full blocks of time, 4 per semester**. A core class takes up a full block, options typically take up a half block of time.

Course Selections

Students should enrol in a full program. It is not a question of what is the minimum that students need for a high school diploma or the minimum for post-secondary requirements. It's a question of planning a well-rounded and complete program. Because we are a full-time school, students should take the courses that they require, then choose option courses to complete their program of studies. Students should choose carefully as course selections determine scheduling of courses. **Changing courses in the fall may not be possible.** Repeating failed courses in the second semester may not occur because planned classes are not available. Students must have pre-requisite courses and prerequisite grades for all courses they select. Course selections will be based on Semester 2 marks. Should your mark improve over the course of the term, course changes can be made prior to the end of the year.

CORE Courses

Choose courses from the listings below to begin your selections. Please place an **X** in the shaded area next to the courses that are best suited for you based on your previous grade's marks and teacher recommendations.

- All core/language courses take up a full block of time (F) and are 5 credits (Cr) unless otherwise indicated in brackets after the course listing.
- Our timetable allots 8 full blocks of time.
- Please refer to the previous page for Grade level timetable expectations.
- Our English Language Learners will have additional ESL Program/Reading Strategies course(s) scheduled for them as required to serve in assisting their language development, provide social engagement opportunities, and foster connections with peers in a linguistically supported space.
- Full year courses take up 2 full blocks of time.
- F indicates full block of time, H indicates a half block of time.
- Applicable course fees are associated with many options.
