

# **WELCOME TO ABJ FOR 2021-2022**

Greetings! The staff of ABJ are very excited to welcome our new and returning students for this upcoming school year. Following is a schedule for student registration where students and their parent/guardian will come to ABJ to register for the upcoming school year – to complete forms, pick up timetables, pick up transit passes (if eligible), have school ID photos taken and pick up their student ID card, drop off overdue textbooks (if any), request student parking pass on Google forms link, complete school fee payments, choose a locker on the Locker Assignment program (Gr.11's and 12's only-bring your old ABJ lock, Gr.9 and 10 lockers are assigned with a lock in place) and have the opportunity to meet with grade level administrators to discuss graduation, educational plans, learning needs, etc.

School fees may be paid at the start of the school year (in person or online), at registration, or parents/guardians may also choose a 10 month payment plan (through PowerSchool). For any families who require financial assistance with school fees, Elk Island Catholic Schools offers a fee waiver program. All necessary forms should be completed and submitted by November in order to allow for processing time. ## Staggered Entry- September 1 and 2

Students in all schools of EICS will be starting the school year with staggered entry. ### **Personalized Education Period (PEP)**

Personalized Education Period (PEP) is an opportunity for students to direct their learning for a more personalized educational experience. PEP will offer students the opportunity to access support for academic needs or engage in a health and wellness activity. Examples of PEP opportunities include fitness training in the workout room, Science lab reviews, essay writing review, etc. Sessions will occur every Wednesday for 60 minutes **except** on early dismissal Wednesdays. Offerings will be determined by individual teachers the week prior to a PEP period and students will have the ability to sign up for any relevant sessions of their choosing via PowerSchool. Teachers and parents will also be able to select a PEP opportunity for a student, whenever they feel there is a need. Attendance will be taken at PEP sessions. The first PEP day will be Wednesday, September 15. More detailed information will be shared in September.

## **School Supplies**

- Students are recommended to acquire school supplies based on their courses and respective teacher expectations. Generally, students require a binder, loose leaf paper, pens, pencils, eraser, etc. for most courses. Any supplies beyond the basics will be directed by their individual teacher based on the nature of the course.
- Students taking Math 10C require a TI84+ calculator.
- Students are invited to bring a device to school as part of our "One to One Project". ABJ recommends that students bring a device that will work best for them and their learning style. The device should be compatible with Google Apps for Education (also known as the Google Suite) Google Docs, Google Drive, etc. We recommend that the screen is large enough for a student to complete assignments, take notes, and edit work, etc. The

amount that a student may use the device will vary depending on the nature of the course and their teacher's expertise. **Students will not be permitted to use a smartphone as their One to One device.** Please also note that students are expected to follow the One to One User Agreement - <a href="https://www.eics.ab.ca/download/100432">https://www.eics.ab.ca/download/100432</a>
