#### What is the Pebbles Program?

The Pebbles Program is a project created by Brittany Jeske, a local grade 12 youth who wishes to give grade 6 and 7 students a head start in the wonderful world of volunteering. IVC (Information & Volunteer Centre) is excited to be partnering with such an enthusiastic young lady who wants nothing more than to encourage and share her love of volunteering with the pre-teens in our community.

#### The Concept

Meetings will be set once to twice a month and be held most times in one of the meeting rooms at the Strathcona County Community Centre. The goal of the program is to teach everyone that no one is too small to make a difference in their community! As a team, we will be brainstorming projects to better our community, and working together to make the project a success! This program will teach the students important values such as selflessness, generosity, and compassion.

#### **Youth Role**

The students role will be to collaborate and think of their own idea's, from coloring with seniors to collecting nonperishable foods for our local food bank. The sky's the limit when it comes to ways to give back to the community.

#### **Parent Role**
